HPCA September 2017 Meeting Minutes

The August Hyde Park Civic Association general meeting was held on Thursday, September 7, 2017, at Rudyard's Pub.

Treasurer Veronica Faubert opened the meeting at 6:35pm. There were approximately 20 people in attendance. Veronica welcomed everyone. There was no guest speaker, so the attendees discussed the recovery efforts after Hurricane Harvey and Hyde Park's planning for **National Night Out 2017**.

Carlos Fernandez asked if anyone had water in their house. Everyone said "No". Big Al's had some water, about an inch or so inside, and Baba Yega Cafe had water damage. They had high water on Welch, but then someone cleaned out the grates and the water level went down. A suggestion was that HPCA could post on Facebook (or send out emails) to let people know to keep the grates clean.

Past President George Sroka commented that we are a very lucky community. It was noted that our neighbor, Geronimo of Campesino's, gave out free coffee to residents after the storm passed to help the neighborhood get back to normalcy. It was also noted that there are still lots of volunteer and donation opportunities. The Food Bank needs food donations (they had ran out of food the other day). It was suggested that we can organize donations for the Food Bank at National Night Out or drop off non-perishable food at the event. Monetary donations may go further than individual donations of food because they can purchase in bulk.

It was also suggested that members of HPCA could post to Facebook if they know where people need help and how to match them with volunteers.

We were also informed that Harris County Democrats have organized a volunteer event to help Harvey flood victims on Thurs., Fri., Sat., and Sun from 9am-2pm and 12pm-6pm.

It was announced that National Night Out will take place on Tuesday, Oct. 3rd.

We need volunteers, especially to:

- Transport tables,
- Set-up and take-down,
- Put up signs and take down afterwards (someone volunteered),
- Picking up food the day of,
- Putting up lights in the park,
- **Scott Rigrod** suggested we find designated drivers to drop people off at their homes after NNO (not so much due to drinking as for safety reasons),
- Need someone with a pick-up truck,
- Need to hang lights by the weekend before NNO. Can tie the plugs up in the trees to keep the homeless people and others from messing with them.

Other topics: Corazon, the little artisan and Mexican crafts shop at Fairview and Waugh, is being sold and will be replaced with townhomes. They are having a sale of 20% off everything. They are closing the end of the month.

Treasurer Veronica Faubert presented the August Treasurer's report. The opening balance was \$17,900 and the closing \$17,800. \$173 in membership via PayPal was received.

Membership Committee Chair Helen Zunka proceeded to give the membership report. Helen noted that we should have 2 or 3 people doing membership and accepting payment at NNO. Last year there was a line at times and some people walked away and never returned.

Deed Restrictions Committee Member Mike McKann noted that the structure next door to Downtown Automotive is boarded up. He also said that the Planning Commission approved the replat of the lots at Commonwealth and Fairview and some individuals and attorneys contacted the developer. The Board has not taken a stand as yet. Our opinion is that Deed Restrictions are still applicable.

Jim Pollard asked about the Willard house being built closer than 4 feet from the property line.

The meeting concluded at 7:15pm.

City of Houston 'Green bin' Recycling Remains Suspended

You may have noticed that the green recycling bins have not been emptied on the regular recycling schedule over the past few weeks. Since Hurricane Harvey, the City of Houston suspended all recycling collections until further notice.

The City of Houston has focused its personnel and trucks that usually collect recycling, junk and tree waste to help with the massive task of cleaning up the debris from the storm. The City has not yet indicated when the service will resume. As we have seen, Houston suffered widespread damage so it would be prudent to assume this temporary suspension could be a number of weeks or months.

This means do not put out your green recycling bin because the City has said it will not be collected. Only trash from the black bins will be collected. Hyde Park's regular trash day is Mondays. If you do see a City of Houston recycle truck, they are handling the storm debris collection.

If you have left your green bin on the street, please bring it in so it doesn't cause an obstruction or more mess.

In the meantime, other options for your recyclables are:

- Take your recyclables to the City of Houston depositories or the Westpark Recycling Center. Opening hours have increased at these centers to cope with the suspension of recycling service. Proof of City of Houston residency is required at the Neighborhood Depositories and the Environmental Service Center. Please bring a current Texas Driver's License or Texas ID and a current utility bill or city property tax receipt.

For a detailed list of the materials accepted at each location please refer to www.houstonsolidwaste.org.

- For glass only there is a drop-off site on Washington Ave. At the time of writing, the receptacle was full.

- Pay to use a private collection service. On the HPCA Facebook page and the Nextdoor site/app there have been positive discussions between neighbors using paid services from various recycling providers. Most of these services also require you to sort your recyclables prior to collection.

Remember to reduce, and where possible, reuse; as well as recycle.

Halloween Safety in the Neighborhood

Halloween in the Montrose area is a time of celebration for all ages—children are out trick-or-treating and for adults, the Montrose Pub Crawl takes place on the Saturday night of the Halloween weekend. It is a time to be aware on the roads whether you are a pedestrian or motorist.

The **National Safety Council** begins its article on safety tips with some frightening statistics.

“In 2014, about 6,300 pedestrian deaths and 145,000 medically consulted injuries occurred among pedestrians in motor vehicle incidents, according to Injury Facts 2016, the statistical report on unintentional injuries created by the National Safety Council.

NSC research reveals the reasons for pedestrian deaths and injuries varies by age. Darting or running into the road accounts for about 70% of pedestrian deaths or injuries for those age 5 to 9 and about 47% of incidents for those 10 to 14. In the U.S., October ranks No. 2 in motor vehicle deaths by month.”

SAFETY TIPS FOR MOTORISTS

- Watch for children walking on roadways, medians and curbs.
- Enter and exit driveways and alleys carefully.
- At twilight and later in the evening, watch for children in dark clothing.

Go During Safe Trick Or Treat Times

You don't have to wait until it is pitch-black outside to go trick-or-treating. A good trick or treat time is right after an early dinner and just before dusk when you can keep better track of your children and you are able to see the others that you encounter on the street. Besides, if you are the first person there, you will have the best selection of candy!

Be Visible

If children are allowed out after dark, fasten reflective tape to their costumes and bags to make sure they are visible. You and they could also wear glow necklaces or carry glow sticks and flashlights.

Stay On Track

It might be tempting to take a short cut through an alley or cut through someone's yard, but that can sometimes pose a danger. Stay on streets and in neighborhoods that are well lit and where there are plenty of people around.

Never Go Alone

It is important that your children have an adult chaperone at all times while trick or treating. You could also discreetly add some emergency identification information such as the child's name, address & phone number to their costume or on a bracelet

in case your child happens to get separated from the group.

Knock On Doors That You Know

Encourage your children to only trick-or-treat at homes where they know the inhabitants. If they know everyone on the street, except for one house, they could ask the neighbors about that one house. If a home is dark or has no Halloween decorations, that is typically a good sign that they are not up for trick-or-treaters.

Don't Go Inside

Remind your little ones that they should never go inside anybody's home while trick-or-treating. They can easily get the candy they seek from the porch or if the homeowner is persistent, inform them to simply turn and walk away.

Say No!

Teach your children that if a stranger offers to give them a ride or take them to a Halloween Party, they should say "no". Stranger danger is important to remember no matter how old your kids are, even while trick-or-treating.

The American Academy of

Pediatrics advises via the NSC:

- If your older children are going alone, plan and review the route that is acceptable to you.
- Agree on a specific time when children should return home.
- Only go to homes with a porch light on and never enter a home or car for a treat.
- Tell your children not to eat any treats until they return home. Make sure your little goblins know that trick or treating is for gathering candy, not eating it as they receive it. You know they're going to be tempted to take a taste before you've had a chance to inspect it, so pack a goody bag with some of your own Halloween candy so they have something to snack on if they just can't wait until they get home.

COSTUMES

All costumes, wigs and accessories should be fire-resistant.

As mentioned earlier, use reflective tape or glow necklaces on their costumes and bags or carry glow sticks and flashlights to make sure you all are visible.

Steer Clear Of Masks

While masks are a fun part of many costumes, do your best to recreate the mask with face paint. Having a mask on can sometimes impair the vision of the child wearing it. With face paint, it is easier for your child to see where they are going and they won't have to lift their mask to have a conversation with a fellow trick or treat. If your child absolutely must wear a Halloween mask, make sure it's a snug fit, is ventilated and has large enough eyeholes so they can see all around them.

When buying Halloween makeup, make sure it is nontoxic and always test it in a small area first. Remove all makeup before children go to bed to prevent skin and eye irritation.

The Crawl takes place on Saturday, October 28th from 6pm, along 12 bars and restaurants between Dunlavy & Montrose on Westheimer, including Brasil, Poison Girl, Pistolero's, the Free Press Graveyard, Boondocks, Stone's Throw, Etro Lounge, Catbirds, Present Company, Doc's Motorworks, Slick Willie's, and El Real Tex-Mex.

A portion of drink sales during the Crawl will be donated to the Houston Area Women's Center.

The 11th Annual Montrose Crawl is brought to you by Free Press Houston and sponsors include Houston brewery 8th Wonder.

Crawl FAQ states "costumes are mandatory!" Every year it's fun and interesting to see the creativity in costumes.



Some of the walking safety tips for kids also applies to adults on Crawl night: be visible, stay on the sidewalks and be aware of motorists.

Luckily for Hyde Park residents, we can er, crawl/walk home afterwards. Make sure your visiting friends assign a designated driver before the evening begins, or use ride-sharing or the Metro bus service (Routes 56, 82 have stops in Montrose). According to the Crawl website, the Crawl has partnered with Uber to create a designated pick-up and drop-off zone on Waughcrest next to Slick Willie's to order an Uber to and from. They also state, to help pedestrian safety, Uber will not accept pick up requests from Westheimer between Dunlavy & Waughcrest during the Montrose Crawl – they recommend Uber is ordered from a cross street such as Waughcrest, Commonwealth, Yupon, Mandell, or Dunlavy.

Due to crowding concerns, they also warn that some bars that are usually pet-friendly may deny entry to people with pets. I've been on a few Crawls and the venues can get very packed with people... so leave the pets at home even if Fido does look adorable in that taco costume.

DID YOU KNOW?

The **Houston Food Bank** is a private non-profit organization founded in 1982 and is America's

largest food bank in distribution to its network of nearly
