Our upcoming February meeting will feature a guest speaker from the Montrose Tax-Increment Reinvestment Zone (TIRZ), re-scheduled from our August meeting. January HPCA Meeting Recap

The meeting of January 7, 2020 was called to order by **Chris Delphin** at 7:00pm. Our speaker from Pacifica Radio was not able to attend. So far this year the speakers we have lined up or hope to line up will be:

Feb — a representative from TIRZ.

Mar — a representative to discuss the Census.

Apr — Abbie Kamin (our new council member for District C).

May — a representative from Pacifica Radio.

Some suggestions for speakers/topics were brought up this evening. Ideas included school crossings at Commonwealth and Michigan (2 blocks from the school but no crossing guards), the new Montrose library, Al Rosen, the Census, and new bike lanes. If you have something you want to hear about, please let the board know.

Treasurer's Report — We currently have \$10,435.21 in our treasury. \$10,000 of that money is in escrow and cannot be touched. Kwik Kopy cashed November and December checks in December. The holiday party included gratuity and a discrepancy over the estimated number and actual number of attendees. We discussed our money being so low and how to remedy that. We need more advertisers and more members. The board had already discussed people going out in teams to solicit additional advertisers. If you would like to be part of this, please email president@hydeparkhouston.org. Carlos Fernandez mentioned that we have a new advertiser—Methodist Hospital. Their ad first appeared in the January issue of the newsletter. We appreciate them.

Deed Restrictions — **Mike McKann** stated that a letter was sent to an AirBnB owners and they have 30 days to respond. We haven't heard

anything back yet. According to our deed restrictions, short term rental properties are not allowed in Hyde Park properties. A tree was saved on Bomar Street and we are hoping it will continue to do well. A new home on Jackson is being built and the owner has contacted our Deed Restriction Committee to ask about the restrictions. Mike said the builder was cooperative and plans will be submitted for approval.

Membership — We would like our membership to grow. To date we have 48 paid members for 2020. A suggestion was made to have Business Members. If you are a business member, your business name would appear in a list in every newsletter. The charge for this would be less than an ad but more than a regular member. The by laws would have to be amended in order to do this. A membership drive will be taking place on Face Book soon. Please see and join our wonderful group. This month Happy Hour will

be January 21st at The Phoenix. Please join us for these fun events. You would get to meet new friends and try new places. The caroling was very well attended. It was decided more family friendly events should be planned.

Clean Up — **Tom and Mary Ellen Whitworth** will have a meeting at their house to discuss the next clean up for Hyde Park and decide on a date. They have acquired vests, gloves and grabbers. They would like for this to be a quarterly event. They will coordinate some with Keep Houston Beautiful and some on our own. Places mentioned to target were the empty lot across from Kindred and the little island at California and Waugh. There is a Hyde Park sign there that is difficult to see. More news about this will be in the newsletter. Please come join us.

Lamar Park — We have a new committee chairman for Lamar Park. Please welcome **Melissa Zarikian**. She wants to make the park better and more usable for all residents. In the park, we pay for maintenance and the city pays for electricity. A suggestion was made to have better lighting in the park. At night, it is too dark. Another point raised was what to do about the Dolphin Fountain. The city has the cash that has already been raised- can we get that money and use it for something? If you walk through the park and see trash, please help by picking it up and putting it in the trashcan. Melissa said the trashcans are routinely emptied.

Our next Civic Club meeting will be February 4. This meeting was adjourned at 8:05.
