## New Montrose Management District Director Presents Plan on Nov. 6

**Meet Montrose Management District's new Executive Director Ben Brewer, who will present at the monthly meeting on 11/6 at Rudyard's, second floor, 6:30pm.**

Ben will present the proposed Montrose District Service, Improvement, and Assessment Plan 2017-2031.

The plan sets forth a vision, mission, goals to be achieved, services to be rendered, and improvements to be made in support of the commercial property owners within the District. It also outlines costs and a proposal for funding the plan for the area comprised by the District.

The mission of the District is to attract public and private investment, provide professional management to the area, and enhance the economic well-being of the community. To assist with this mission, the District is empowered to finance projects

and plans related to public safety, business and economic development, mobility and transportation, maintenance, and beautification. The District leverages local resources, public and private, to enhance the business environment and quality of life in the area.

**Ben Brewer** recently relocated to Houston from San Antonio, Texas where he provided management services for center city and urban development projects through his company, Brewer Urban Management Consulting LLC. Prior to that he served as President of Downtown Alliance/San Antonio and the Centro San Antonio Management Corporation (the downtown Public Improvement District), creating and running those non-profit organizations over a 26 year career focused on the revitalization of downtown San Antonio and the center city.

Ben is a native of the Montrose neighborhood in Houston, Texas.

He received a Bachelor of Architecture from the University of Oregon in 1977, and was registered and practiced architecture in San Antonio and Houston. Brewer is currently a Board Member of the Southwest School of Art in San Antonio, a full member of the Urban Land Institute, a member of the Congress for the New Urbanism, and a member of the Rotary Club of San Antonio where he served as its President in 2011. In 2015, Brewer was recognized by Centro San Antonio with a Lifetime Achievement Award for his leadership and organizational successes during his career in San Antonio.

## Recycling returns to Houston

The news that the City of Houston will resume its recycling service in November was met with relief on social media. Hyde Park falls under "Week A" and collection will begin the week of **Monday, November 20, 2017**.

Week B households will have recycling resume the week before. Residential recycle pick up will resume operation as normal. Place your green cart at the curb between 6 p.m. the day before and 7 a.m. on the scheduled collection day.

### What You Need To Know

#### **No Hurricane Harvey Debris should be in the recycling cart.**

While we recognize that many customers used their carts to haul demolition material to the curb immediately after Harvey, material of that type is not recyclable and is considered trash.

**Recycling should be loose and not bagged in the cart.** Loose material speeds the processing line and ensures that contamination is kept at a minimum.

**Glass is not accepted** at this time and should be taken to a convenient drop-off site.

**Junk Waste and Yard Waste services remain suspended** until further notice. Those crews continue to work on Hurricane Harvey debris removal.

**All city drop-off locations continue to work on a 7 day schedule** until further notice. These sites include the Neighborhood Depositories, Westpark Recycling Center and the Environmental Service Center. Remember to check with 3-1-1 or the department's webpage for operating hours.

## KINDRED church aims to provide calm space in Hyde Park

**Someone once told me** that our society has lost its communal gathering places. We don't have the wide open plazas of Spain and our town squares are pretty but not much else. I don't think it's true. At least, I don't want it to be true and so I actively work for this bold notion that people can still do beautiful things together when they have shared space. Yes, we have our bars and restaurants, clubs and parks, but there's something unique in having a little more elbow room in a neutral place that creates an opportunity for connection and creation. Hyde Park has that kind of space. We don't have a city-supported community center, but we have a neighbor-supported church building that functions in much the same way.

2515 Waugh is now home to **Kindred Lutheran**, a Dinner Church. But before that it was Grace and it has been a staple on the corner of our community 70 years. These days we are dedicated to nurturing the spirit and sharing space. Underneath the calm oak trees and limestone walls is a vibrant center that hosts art shows and concerts, a farmer's market (Central City Co-op) and mentorship for homeless youth (Montrose Grace Place), speaker events and parties, advocacy and justice workshops, support groups and meetings. It's even an impromptu venue for the best National Night Out in town! This is our launchpad for new ideas and a refuge for the hungry.

Having so many different folks under one roof encourages collaboration and creates innovative opportunities.

To be a part of all this amidst the stunning woodwork and stained glass of the historic building is a beautiful gift. I find myself often giving impromptu tours of the hidden gems throughout the church. But the age of place also bring challenges. We've fought termites and roof leaks that have damaged original woodwork. We are a small community of faith, but we dream big. We don't just want to patch the holes; we want to rebuild the kitchen to commercial standards so that it would serve those in need and aspiring chefs. Perhaps we may find that those populations are one in the same.

We strive to honor the history of this place by diligently restoring its architectural beauty and by filling it with new life. We will work hard to preserve this neighborhood treasure, not as a museum but as living stones that bring people together for the better. Here's how you can help – think of Kindred for your next meeting or event space, rent private office space upstairs, or consider sending a financial gift that supports our shared community center. Pray for us and for all those who come through these doors. We give thanks each day for you, our neighbors.

# Did Texas Host the First Thanksgiving?

It's common knowledge that the first Thanksgiving was celebrated at Plymouth in 1621.

But some say the "real" first Thanksgiving took place over 20 years before near present day El Paso, when at least 400 Spaniards, in an exploration led by **Juan de Oñate**, feasted with the Mansos tribe. While everyone recognizes its importance in the history of North America, some argue that, unlike the feast at Plymouth, it's not a harvest festival.

Oñate was born into wealth and plied his trade for years as a silver miner near his hometown of Zacatecas throughout his twenties, meanwhile helping establish smaller missions in the area. Because of his experience as both a prospector and, as he saw it, a capable amateur conquistador, he began petitioning the King Philip II for permission to explore, Catholicize and colonize Nuevo Mexico.

After years of petitioning provincial governors, Oñate was granted his contract in 1595 and his party launched three years later in 1598, leaving with an estimate 400 to 500

people and around 7,000 head of cattle.

The 50-day journey across the Chihuahua Desert was unforgiving to the expedition. Their provisions ran out quickly and the desert provided little respite in the form of running water or rainfall. But, after five days without water, the party finally spotted the banks of the Rio Grande.

Ten days later on 30 April 1598, Oñate decided to celebrate both the near scrape with death in the desert and the party's arrival at San Elizario. Oñate extended the invitation to the nearby Mansos tribe and held a mass that both commemorated La Toma – Spain's claim on the Rio Grande and all its tributaries – and prayed for an end to the crippling drought that had affected the region.

While the feast didn't completely incorporate all the trappings of a traditional Anglo, harvest-centric Thanksgiving celebrations, some argue it qualifies as the first, as it's a celebration between both European colonists and natives of the New World.

Whether it is the "real" first Thanksgiving is up for debate.

Still, that's not even the only claim to the first Thanksgiving in Texas, according to the Texas Almanac. A historical marker outside of Canyon claimed Francisco Vázquez de Coronado celebrated the first Thanksgiving near the Palo Duro Canyon in 1541 – though some debate whether that was a true Thanksgiving or a celebration of the Feast of the Ascension, which falls in the spring. And the first official Thanksgiving in Texas was declared by Gov. George Wood, setting the date for the first Thursday in December.

Did you know that daylight saving time ends at 2:00 AM on Sunday, November 5? Credit for Daylight Saving Time belongs to **Benjamin Franklin**, who first suggested the idea in 1784.

The idea was revived in 1907, when **William Willett**, an Englishman, proposed a similar system in the pamphlet *The Waste of Daylight*.
