Get the 4-1-1 on Houston's 3-1-1 Service Helpline

Houston 311 is the city's 24-hour, non-emergency service and information line. Open 365 days a year, the helpline is a value resource for residents to report issues that require city attention but are not immediate threats to life or property. It is also a portal for searching for government services, phone numbers, and information.

Common reasons to call include reporting missed trash or recycling pick up, potholes, street or traffic light outages, water leaks, illegal dumping, and graffiti. Examples of requests specific to Hyde Park include requesting maintenance

or trash pick up in Lamar Park or maintenance needed for the Dolphin Fountain. Other current common case reports are related to the vacant lot on the corner of Fairview and Commonwealth and the city ordinance violations for failure to maintain lawn landscaping and homeless encampment.

Submit a 311 service request by dialing 311 from any landline or mobile phone or 713-837-0311 directly. Or visit <https://www.houstontx.gov/311/>. There's also an option to download a mobile app. The website also features a navigable city map showing current 311 service requests including case details down to the city block level.

Changing 'Neartown' to 'Montrose' and more

Neartown President's Council
meeting – January 8, 2026

Present from the 9 civic clubs

with voting power: Jack Valinski, President, Mehdi Rais, VP, Steven Detering for Avondale, Lloyd for North Montrose, Kevin for WAMM, Steve Longmire and Nicholas Whitaker for First Montrose Commons, myself, Joanna for Lancaster Place, and Karen for East Montrose.

Attending members of public:

Audrey Nath – running for District C; Rep for Twila Carter; Rep for Julian Ramirez; Someone named Carl; two reps from group trying to activate Superneighborhood 61, Downtown, who are having tussle with Eado folks and maybe the city about authority.

Elections - Karen reelected as President of Council; Jack, Mehdi, Steve, John, Lloyd agreed to again be put on slate for vote.

East Montrose ended security patrol.

- Too expensive. East Montrose

had 3500 a month for 3 hr shift a week, extra holidays. Flexible. SEAL was the private security company, took up substantial time to supervise. Crime went down, at least when started off, with 5 nights a week. Used Billsby app to track people's commitments to pay.

Businesses & institutions as

members? Do we want Neartown to have them?

- St. Thomas is interested in hosting a NNO event in its courtyard. Jack is a bit concerned about business members, others more curious. I have some concerns too: "I don't want to have developers at the bloody table." Civic clubs are all over the map on this. Hyde Park limits to individuals whose businesses are in area. WAMM has eight "sponsors," and also a business coalition doing landscaping and crime stuff. The business coalition is non-voting.

Priorities for year included Best practices for civic clubs, Voice for Montrose, Resources for residents, beautification

Need to revamp website to reflect priorities and update data & contacts. Discussed whether to pay to update, get reimbursed, find volunteers. Neartown has Zelle – need to put on website. treasurer@neartown.org \$100 voluntary donations due now. Nick volunteered for website committee.

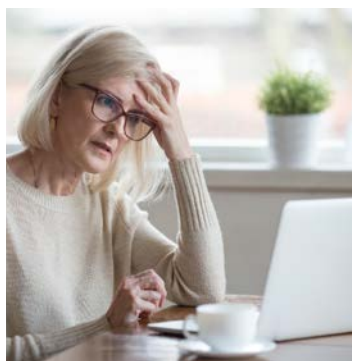
Need to Recruit new civic clubs:

Audubon and west Mandell? Courtland place? No. They never show interest. Assign one person to one civic club each to recruit new members?

Name change from Neartown

to Montrose – I volunteered to investigate name change feasibility with entity. "Neartown" was coined by real estate agents in approx. the 1970's to rebrand away from the word "Montrose," a place name associated with its gay population and activity.

Beautification - WAMM applied for \$5000 matching grant that is progressing through system. Mehdi thinks we should stress this as he doesn't find Montrose attractive and it will help with property values.

TIRZ Minutes January 20 2026

Parking Survey: 40% complaints, 40% want more parking

This month's meeting was held at the office of the law firm that administers the TIRZ. I had to win the attention of a janitor to get in the Greenway Plaza building for it. Public comments were largely via zoom, delivered by the usual suspects. They concerned affordability, an objection to executive sessions by the board, tree protection, and miscellany.

Gauge Engineering (Ali) reported on current projects. The Cherryhurst procurement process has completed and Gauge has chosen the second cheapest, which was the cheapest bid on the aborted first round and submitted a robust tree plan. The cheapest bid was disqualified for an incomplete application. The price is \$960,000, a little under the \$1 million estimated. The board approved the vendor. Mid-February is the targeted start date. West Alabama is still early

in engineering. Not even 60% done. No hard goal dates right now. Safe Routes to Schools – they were able to get crosswalks approved at Bomar and Stanford, but not the flashing ones, just simple ones. The City has to approve because it has to maintain them. Most of the development will be in the NW quarter of the affected area.

Christi from Goodman, the grant writer reported on parking survey results: Roughly 40% of comments were complaining about unwanted parked cars, 40% seeking more opportunities to park, and the rest touched fairly evenly on those two subjects.

Public engagement committee – They're preparing to spread awareness of start of Cherryhurst project. \$5000 for Mandell public engagement funds approved.

Affordable housing committee – Robert Gutthart. Met with Cedric Hussein/LeSein (sp) with the City of Houston about setting up an open house or stakeholder meeting to discuss supporting affordable housing. The City is supportive. Desire to have ideas going in. Cedric suggested meeting with the land banks, which they will do. Committee members are exploring a possible plan to offer landlords to “buying down doors,” subsidizing a building in exchange for reduced rent.

Also interested in more utility box art and a cultural arts district designation, which would open doors to certain arts grants. What does buying down doors mean? Not a voucher. Or a tax rebate? Discussions as to modeling based on a downtown project, which was incentivizing new construction. Jennifer with the City of Houston weighed in (mainly with some skepticism, it seemed to me).

Three board directors re-elected, Rose joins Deed Restrictions Committee

HPCA Board directors are elected for staggered two-year terms. This year, four Board positions were open for election: President, Secretary, Deed Restrictions Seat #2, and At-Large.

The vote was held at the regular membership meeting on November 11th. Three of the incumbents were re-elected: Sarah Frazier for President, Liam McElhiney for Secretary, and Macy Bodenheimer for At-Large position.

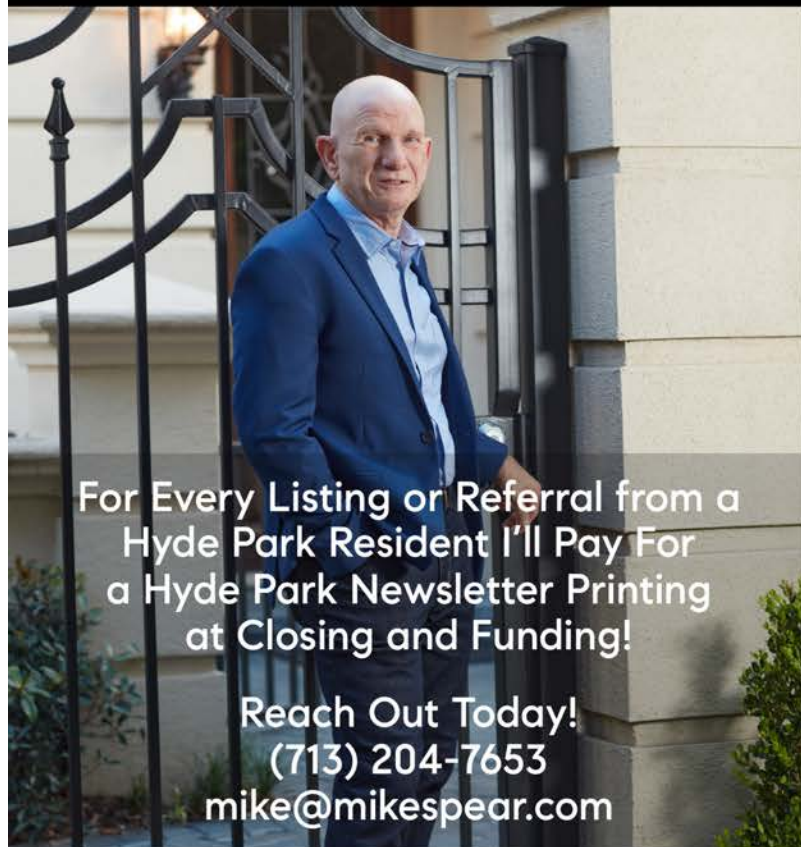
