# August Monthly Meeting Minutes

The Hyde Park Civic Association monthly meeting held on Aug. 7 was opened at 6:38pm at Rudyard's by **Past President Macy Bodenhamer**, with about 40 people in attendance.

**Bodenhamer** introduced the guest speakers for the evening, which included candidates for the Texas House of Representatives. See below for a recap of the speakers' presentation. Residents were encouraged to vote in the November elections, and in early voting this month in favor of Prop A to fight flooding in Harris County.

Following the speakers, Bodenhamer opened the general business meeting. **Treasurer Veronica Faubert** did not have a full report but offered to share financials to anyone interested who wanted to follow up. **Membership Chair Helen Zunka** announced that **Senate Candidate Todd Litton** will speak at the next monthly meeting in Sept. **Candidate Dan Crenshaw** was invited to speak, but unable to attend.

**Helen** indicated that paid membership is in the low 100s, with three new members joining this month.

**Deed Restrictions Chair Mike McKann** had no new news to report on deed restrictions activity. A resident inquired about the status of the proposed Mandell Montrose midrise development at the corner of Commonwealth and Fairview. It was noted that the property was longer no listed on HAR.com for active sales.

**Bodenhamer** stated that the 2019 HPCA Board of Directors elections will take place at the Nov. 6 meeting. She noted that several board positions, including president, secretary, and deed restrictions committee member, are currently open for appointment. Interested candidates should contact a board member.

An audience member pointed out that the recycling dates in the Aug. newsletter were incorrect. The dates will be correct in the Sept. newsletter.

The meeting adjourned at 7:58pm.

## August Guest Speakers Recap

At the Aug. 6 association meeting, Texas House of Representative candidates were invited to speak. Hyde Park territory is split into House District 134 and 147, so candidates from both districts were invited to speak.

**District 134 Democratic Representative Sarah Davis**, who is serving her fourth term, addressed the audience. She provided an overview of her accomplishments while in office, which included many committee representations and efforts related to public health, economics, women's rights and Harvey relief.

**District 134 Republican Candidate Allison Lami Sawyer**, running against Davis, spoke. She emphasized her humble background and entrepreneurship as a physicist. She noted the importance of funding infrastructure, STEM in schools, and leadership beyond party lines.

**District 147 Democratic Candidate Garnet Coleman** was not able to participate due to a scheduling conflict.

**District 147 Republican Candidate Thomas Wang**, running against Coleman, spoke. He emphasized the need to give a voice for underserved communities and noted a focus on ending homelessness in Houston. He supports community sustainability and empowerment.



# Interview with Rachel Andres, Thairapy Salon and Spa Owner

Rachel Andres, owner and operator of Thairapy Salon and Spa at 1721 Waugh Drive is the latest subject of our local interview series. Rachel sat down with Hyde Park resident Helen Zunka to talk about her long history in our neighborhood, what Thairapy has to offer their customers, and how they're giving back to the community.

## Are you from Houston?

Yeah, I'm born and raised in Houston. Lived in Missouri City, and I came back and moved to EaDo in 2004. So we've gone through all the changes there, and within the last four years, we moved to the old Sixth Ward district, and we love it! But the business has been in Montrose since 2010.

## So, how did you get into this business?

I have loved doing hair. I've been playing in hair since Junior High. I've been doing it over 20 years. And the last 2 years I stepped away because I wanted to focus more on the business. We have a boutique now and we now have Thairapy products that I'm really proud of, as well. It's our very own brand. So that's been a fun venture, and it's still going on.

## Thairapy products? Are you selling them online?

We're selling them here, in the salon with us and just started it last year, with the plan to expand more on social media, of course. We just found Etsy and working on Amazon. Hopefully at some point ecommerce, on our website would be great to do.

## Hair products, skin care?

Right now, we've focused on shampoos and conditioners and more deep treatments, like an intense mask. So, more of the essentials.

## What do you think has been your key to success here?

I think it's so important to be able to have the skill level and technique behind what we do every day: beautifying people. I think it's so important to have the service piece to taking care of customers- day in and day out, and thinking about that Wednesdays and Thursdays are not different than Fridays and Saturdays. Every day is important when you're dealing with the community, the public. I mean you want someone that sits in your chair and gets their hair done, or their face done to feel they are the only one that matters, right now. That is how I would like it. I would want someone to do the same for me. Making them feel special, is so important. We've been in business for 12+ years and thankfully it's working. And hopefully we'll be around for a while. And Montrose has been wonderful to us.

## Are you planning on expanding?

We've thrown it around. Maybe, maybe.

## What brought you here to this neighborhood? Was it the opportunity to buy this property?

That's what brought us here, but we were six blocks up the street. We were right where the Pei Wei is with Whole Foods and CVS from 2005 to 2010. We were there for five years, and our lease was coming up and we thought, "You know what? We want to stay in this area." We wanted to look in and around the area to really grow and expand, and this came available, and it was really a blessing because this was the Methodist Thrift Store. And it was abandoned and everything was left as though it was from the 80s. In each room, there were still thrift store items that were in here.

## Just left behind?

Left behind. And so we wanted to keep some of what was here, so these stations were repurposed. Those were part of the thrift shop. There's a few other things that we kept. I have an old framed picture of what it was before to remind me of what was here. It's crazy!

## Thairapy is a great name. How did you think of it?

So, a friend and I, we sat down at a round table with some drinks enjoying ourselves. We put our thinking caps on, and he helped me just come up with it. We wanted it to be healing and a relaxing experience. I wanted it to be where people think about the healing process, so like Therapy! So, when they come in we want them to have that feeling, that vibe, so we say, we're spirited yet with a relaxed vibe.

## What's your most popular service or product?

I'd say our most popular is our haircuts and our blowouts, that's our bread and butter, and color and chemical. People come in and they want to get those ends freshened up and our blow outs to go out for an event or for the evening, and of course the spa side, facial, massage. Our most popular product is our L'anza hair product. It's healing, it's reparative, and it's results oriented; people like that.


## Volunteer Reception



## INTERVIEW WITH RACHEL ANDRES (CONT'D FROM PAGE 3)



*Get ready for a #thairapysession.*

### **What is the best all-natural exfoliator?**

Eminence has a great one: Coconut Sugar Scrub, or Strawberry Rhubarb Microfoliant.

### **What about natural hair color? Is there such a thing?**

There is: Keune. We love our hair color. And I would say the difference between a grocery store hair color and a salon hair color is that a grocery store percentage of ammonia is about 21% plus. And if you get a professional salon color, like Keune, it's less than 2%, and it keeps the cuticle/ shaft from blowing open and then causing it to dry out like those kind of things, so, we do have a more gentle color line. It is even lower ammonia, it's gentle, it's called So Pure Keune color.

### **You had an event not long ago where people could donate hair?**

Yes, we are an affiliate, an ambassador, for Wigs for Kids. Wigs for Kids provide hair 12 inches or longer, not colored, to children that are of all needs, that either have cancer or any kind of conditions, illnesses. It's such a special thing because children that have to deal with that kind of stuff shouldn't have to worry about- not having hair. Kids are already so mean to each other. We had that one event, but we also offer it throughout the year where people can come in for a discounted rate, \$15 for a man, \$30 for a woman, \$10 for a child haircut. This allows them to cut off the 12 inches and we would send it over to them. So yeah, we try to help out in the community.

### **Anything you want to share with your neighbors?**

I just want people to know that we're proud that we're here and have a couple people that have been with us for 12 years plus, and for the most part a lot of them have been here close to five years. And in this kind of industry it's tough to keep people around. We're such creative people. So we're proud of that. And like I said, owning the property and the buildings, we're just proud that we're part of Montrose that way. We love our Montrose residents! You know it's interesting though, it took a little bit for Montrose residents to come around, but now lately customers say, "I live right here in the neighborhood", and it's awesome.

# District 2 U.S. House Representatives Candidate Profiles



## HPCA SEPTEMBER 4TH MEETING SPEAKER AT RUDYARD'S: TODD LITTON

We are very excited to have **Todd Litton** join us at the September meeting. Todd Litton is a strong Democrat who is fighting to bring common sense and common decency to Congress. His values include equality and respect for all people; helping people to achieve lifelong learning; ensuring all Americans have access to affordable and effective healthcare; and building an infrastructure that is as resilient as our people.

Todd Litton is a leader and innovator in the battle to help families find affordable, quality care for all of our children. Todd led Citizen Schools-Texas as Executive Director in Houston and Austin for six years, connecting more than 2,000 low-income middle school students to college and career opportunities. Prior to his work at Citizen Schools, Todd directed Preschool for ALL, a joint partnership between early childhood organizations and business leaders to expand access to high quality preschool.

Todd's community involvement includes board leadership on the The Immunization Partnership, Small Steps Nurturing Center, the Texas Lyceum Association, Good Works Houston, University of Houston's Nonprofit Leadership Alliance, the Southgate Civic Club, and the University Place Association. He also served as Chair of the City of Houston's Tower Commission under Mayor Bill White.

Todd graduated from Duke University, the University of Texas School of Law and holds an MBA from Rice University's Jones School of Business. Todd previously worked in investments and practiced law. Todd lives near the Medical Center with his wife, Dr. Jennifer Litton a breast cancer doctor and researcher, and their twin daughters and son, who attend middle school in Houston ISD.



## REPUBLICAN CANDIDATE: DAN CRENSHAW

Republican candidate **Dan Crenshaw** was invited but is unable to attend.

Lieutenant Commander Dan Crenshaw (Retired) is the Republican nominee to replace retiring

Congressman Ted Poe as the Representative for Texas' 2nd Congressional District. Dan is originally from Houston, Texas. His father's career in the Texas oil and gas industry moved his family all over the world, including Ecuador and Colombia. As a result, Dan is fluent in Spanish. From an early age, Dan knew that he wanted to serve his country with the most elite fighting force in history: the U.S. Navy SEALs. Dan graduated from Tufts University in 2006, where he earned his Naval officer commission through Navy ROTC. He immediately reported to SEAL training in Coronado, CA, where he met his future wife, Tara, just a few months later. After graduating SEAL training, Dan deployed to Fallujah, Iraq to join SEAL Team Three, his first of five deployments overseas.

On Dan's third deployment in 2012, his life changed forever. After six months of combat operations, Dan was hit by an IED blast during a mission in Helmand province, Afghanistan. He was evacuated and awoke from his medically induced coma learning that his right eye had been destroyed in the blast and his left eye was still present, but badly damaged. Dan was completely blind and the doctors did not believe he would ever see again. Tara stood by him every day and

night, keeping faith and praying he would see again. After several difficult surgeries, he eventually regained sight in his left eye, a miracle according to the head surgeon. Dan refused to quit and went on to deploy twice more, first back to the Middle East in 2014 and then South Korea in 2016.

Dan was medically retired in September of 2016, after ten years in the SEAL Teams. He left service with two Bronze Stars (one with Valor), the Purple Heart, and the Navy Commendation Medal with Valor, among many other recognitions. Soon after, Dan completed his Master in Public Administration at the Harvard Kennedy School of Government. In September of this year, he was back in Houston, volunteering for days on end in areas of Katy devastated by Hurricane Harvey. He saw first-hand the unthinkable losses that his neighbors suffered, but he also saw Texan grit and resilience. He wanted to do more, and this November Dan and Tara decided that the best way to serve the people of Texas would be in elected office.

Dan is now running for the U.S. House of Representatives in Texas' 2nd district, where Dan grew up and where his family lives now. He believes in service before self, and understands that there is no higher calling than service to the American people. His wife Tara is no stranger to service either: she comes from a career Navy family, and is an active fundraiser for families of fallen service members and suicide prevention.

Dan can no longer fight on the battlefield, but he can bring the integrity, leadership, vision, and tenacity learned in the SEAL teams to fight in Congress for common sense policies that ensure our nation's prosperity and security, represent our Judeo-Christian values, and again give Texans a reason to be proud of their leaders.
